**Well Pet Requirements:** All vaccines must have been administered by a licensed veterinarian. Pets may have the exams and vaccinations completed at Creekside Pet Care Center (CPCC), or the client must present written proof of current vaccinations for each pet prior to attending Doggie Day Care (DDC). If external parasites are found during services, pets will be treated at the cost to the client. Although sick or unvaccinated pets are not permitted to attend DDC, the client acknowledges that they are placing the pet into an area in which communicable diseases may pass between seemingly healthy pets. If following a provided service the pet shows signs of illness, the client may not hold Creekside liable for any inadvertent exposure the pet may have contracted, and if the client requests an exam, treatment, or medication for the pet that it will be provided by CPCC at full cost to the client.

<b>Adult Dogs</b>	<b>Must be current on Rabies, Distemper/Parvo Annual, Influenza Annual, Bordetella Intranasal Annual or Bordetella Injectable Bi-Annually, and Leptospirosis Annual</b>
<b>Puppies</b>	<b>Puppies Must be at least 12 weeks of age and have received (2) Distemper/Parvo vaccines, (1) Bordetella vaccine, (1) Influenza, and (1) Leptospirosis</b>

**Doggie Daycare Safety Policy:** While all dogs must pass the preliminary temperament test to be eligible for the DDC program, some behaviors may be revealed only after a dog has attended daycare for several days. If conduct deemed unacceptable or dangerous occurs and after our staff has taken measures to correct and re-teach the behaviors in question, CPCC reserves the right to immediately deny any dog's eligibility at any time if a dog shows the potential to cause severe injury or to be unwilling to adjust to the DDC program. The client agrees to the terms of DDC and releases CPCC and staff as well as the owners of other dogs attending DDC of all liability. DDC is not a training ground for dogs with difficult issues nor is it the responsibility of CPCC attendants to devote extensive attention to a single dog.

While in DDC, dogs may not wear chain or pronged collars in which other dogs' teeth might be caught; flat or rolled collars are best. Electronic collars are acceptable, but the Optional Services Handling Form must be signed in addition to this form. Dogs must not have any conditions which can be aggravated by active play or have any contagious disease symptoms such as coughing, etc.

Although the DDC environment is a safe and well supervised area, the client acknowledges that rough play can be an inherent part of dog behavior in DDC. Despite well trained staff and constant supervision, play may become too rough and an injury to pets may result. Should pets require immediate treatment before the client can be contacted, the client authorizes CPCC to treat pets as deemed necessary by a veterinarian on staff. Following any injury, CPCC will attempt to contact the client as soon as possible, but regardless the client acknowledges and assumes all financial responsibility for treatment provided by signing this document. Regarding behavior, if the staff determines that any dog shows excessive stress or aggressive behavior in DDC, the client gives permission for CPCC to transfer the dog to an individual inside enclosure within our facility. We will make every effort to inform the client of the situation. CPCC reserves the right to immediately deny any dog's eligibility at any time if a dog causes severe injury or displays dangerous aggression.

**Daycare Packages Policy:** Daycare Packages may be used for full days only and may not be used for daycare on boarding days.

**Doggie Daycare Socialization Process:** Assertive leadership techniques will be used as needed to help a dog give our staff its trust, thus becoming calm which enables the dog to experience the full benefits of canine socialization. Techniques may include but not be limited to:

- Withholding attention, praise, eye contact, etc
- Slip leashing to guide dogs who are confused as to where they need to go, such as "outside"
- "Back tie" a leash to the fence inside/ outside when a dog's actions are causing instability in the pack or danger to themselves
- Leashing to a staff member to avoid and correct remote misbehaviors (such as eating feces, rocks, etc.)
- Slip leashing dogs who are 'confused' as to where they need to go, such as "outside"
- Crating a dog to help pace themselves and as a part of disciplinary system for continuing misbehavior
- Use of an appropriate pressure with a fingertip to the dog's neck to stop unwanted behavior
- Water squirted at dog's rear or a shrill whistle to break tension to get a dog's attention and gain compliance.
- Finally, see Optional Handling Form for other training tools we may recommend being used with consent.

The Doggie Daycare department hours are 7am-7pm Monday-Friday and closed to the public on Saturday and Sunday. Should a pet be dropped off or picked up before 7am or after 7pm, a **Convenience Fee of \$80.00 will be assessed** to the account.

**Acknowledgment of Risk & Liability Release:** At Creekside, we take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety and well-being of all dogs in our care. All dogs are required to pass an introduction process and are continuously monitored by staff. However, clients understand that when dogs of varying sizes and temperaments interact and play together, there is always an inherent risk of injury, illness, or in rare cases, even death. Because dogs are animals with instincts and behaviors that cannot be fully guaranteed or predicted, Creekside cannot be held responsible for changes in behavior or any incidents that may occur during play. By enrolling their pet, the client acknowledges and accepts these risks and agrees to release Creekside, its owners, and staff, from any and all liability related to injuries, accidents, or other incidents that may occur while their dog is in our care.
